0 - 1 year	5 days	Blood test (heel prick)	To test for illnesses such as cystic fibrosis and sickle cell disease	Midwife	Carried out at home
	0 - 3 months	New born Hearing Test	Early detection of any hearing problems	Hearing Screener	Local hospital or health clinic
	6 weeks	Development Review and BCG immunisation	To see that your baby is developing well and to protect against TB	GP, or Community Paediatrician	GP Surgery or Child Health Clinic
	2 months	1st Primary Immunisation	To protect against infectious diseases such as Pneumococcal infections, Whooping cough	Practice Nurse or Health Visiting Team	GP Surgery, Community Child Health Clinic
	3 months	2nd Primary Immunisation	To protect against infectious diseases such as Meningitis C, Whooping cough	Practice Nurse or Health Visiting Team	GP Surgery, Community Child Health Clinic
	4 months	3rd Primary Immunisation	To protect against infectious diseases such as Meningitis C, Whooping cough	Practice Nurse or Health Visiting Team	GP Surgery, Community Child Health Clinic
	8 - 10 months	Development Review	To see that your child is developing well	Health Visiting Team	Health Visitor, Community Child Health Clinic or Children's Centre
1 - 5 years	12 months	Immunisation	To protect against infectious diseases such as Hib and Meningitis	Practice Nurse or Health Visiting Team	GP Surgery, Community Child Health Clinic
	13 months	Immunisation	To protect against infectious diseases such as Measles, Mumps and Pneumococcal infections	Practice Nurse or Health Visiting Team	GP Surgery, Community Child Health Clinic
	2 - 3 years	Development Review	To ensure that your child is developing well	Health Visiting Team and Early Years staff	Health Visitor, Community Child Health Clinic or Children's Centre
	3½ - 4 years	Immunisation	To protect against infectious diseases such as Tetanus, Whooping cough, MMR	Practice Nurse or Health Visiting Team	GP Surgery, Community Child Health Clinic
	4 - 5 years	Health Review on starting Primary School	To see that your child is healthy and achieving	School Nurse	School Nurse at your child's Primary School
5 years and over	12 - 13 years (girls only)	Immunisation (3 injections over the year)	To protect against cervical cancer	School Nurse	School Nurse at your child's Secondary School
	14 - 15 years	Immunisation	To boost your child's protection against diseases such as polio, tetanus and diphtheria	School Nurse	School Nurse at your child's Secondary School
